**Sensational quilts start with

Create a luxurious silk window-pane quilt using built-in Diane Gaudynski embroidery designs and quilt-as-you-go embroidery and sewing techniques.

The *Embroidered Silk Quilt* features 49 embroidered seven-inch silk squares accented with one-inch ribbon windowpanes.



Supplies

Fabric

- Blocks – Silk Dupioni
 - Turquoise 15 blocks 1 ¼ yds.
 - Green 14 blocks 1 ¼ yds.
 - Orange 10 blocks 7/8 yd.
 - Fuchsia 5 blocks 1/2 yd.
 - Red 5 blocks 1/2 yd.
- Backing & Binding – 5 yds.
- Low Loft Batting (45" width) – 4 ¼ yds.

Notions

- 1" Black Grosgrain Ribbon - 20 yds.
- Embroidery Thread to Match Fabric - Green, Orange, Turquoise, Fuchsia, Red and Black
- Organ Machine Needle #70 for Embroidery
- Microtex Machine Needle #70 for Construction

Machine and Accessories

- BERNINA 830 Sewing & Embroidery Machine
- BERNINA Jumbo Hoop
- Embroidery Foot #26
- Dual Feed Reverse Sewing Foot #1D
- Dual Feed Edgestitch Foot #10D
- Dual Feed Patchwork Foot with guide #57D

Embroidery Designs

- Found on the BERNINA 830>Embroidery>Diane Gaudynski Folder
- 25 Blocks---Design DG01
 - 24 Blocks---Design Assortment using DG02, 06, 07, 08, 10, 12, 15, 16, 20

Cut and Prepare Fabric Strips

Fabric	Strips 15"x45"	Blocks
Turquoise Silk	3	15
Green Silk	3	14
Orange Silk	2	10
Fuchsia Silk	1	5
Red Silk	1	5
Black Backing	10	49
Batting	10	49

Cut fabric, batting and backing into 15" X 45" strips.

Mark a 7 ½" square in center of each strip. Mark *two* more 7 ½" squares to each side of center for a total of *five* squares per strip.

Hoop and Embroidery Strips

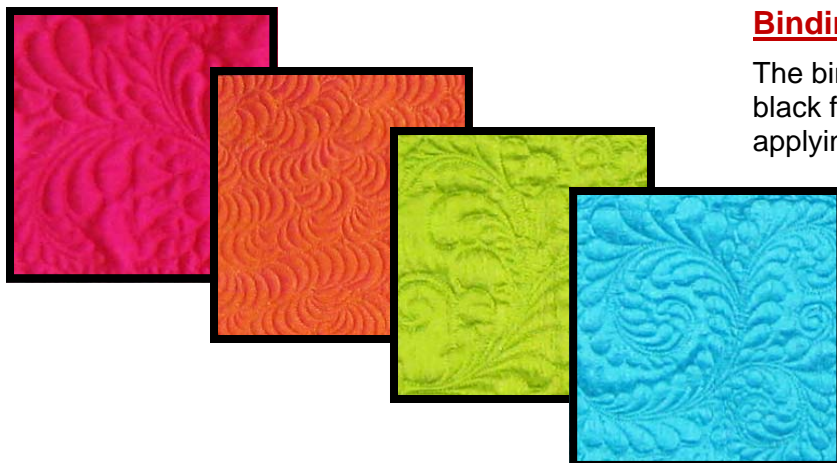
Hoop all three layers (silk, batting & backing) in the Jumbo Hoop as close to center as possible.

Select one of the designs listed from the Diane Gaudynski folder. Enlarge each design as per guidelines below:

⇒ Design DG01: Enlarge 170% or 177mm X 177mm. Embroider 25 blocks of this design. It will be the alternating block.

⇒ Designs DG02, 06, 07, 08, 10, 12, 15, 16, 20: Enlarge to approximately 150mm X 150mm. *Width and length may have to be sized separately.* Embroider 24 blocks using these designs.

Alternate designs on the strips of various silk colors. Make a total of 49 blocks.



Cut and Sew Embroidered Blocks

When embroidery is finished, square blocks to 7 ½".

Lay out blocks in 7 rows with 7 blocks in each row. Make sure to start the first row with the #01 design block and alternate this block in each row.

Attach the Dual Feed Patchwork Foot with Guide #57D and engage the Dual Feed. Using a 1/4" seam allowance, seam the blocks with the **wrong sides** together so that seam is to the front of the quilt.

Press seams open.

Attach the Dual Feed Reverse Pattern Foot #1D, making sure Dual Feed is still engaged. Zig zag over the open seams with a wide, open zig zag and black thread. This step will hold the seams down and make them smoother when covering with ribbon.



Center ribbon over seams, all in one direction. Pin or glue stick in place. Attach Dual Feed Edgestitch Foot #10D and engage Dual Feed. Using a straight stitch with needle left of the center guide, stitch the ribbon in place. Turn the quilt and sew in opposite direction to stitch other side of ribbon. Repeat to sew all ribbon in place.

Binding the Quilt

The binding is a traditional quilt binding from the black fabric. Using the Dual Feed Foot #57D makes applying binding easy and exact.
