I am also a newbie as this is my 2nd quilt. Worked on Artista 640 with foot #37. Cut strips and then blocks for my HST. Took quite a long time with plenty of unpicking to get all my blocks perfectly aligned at all the corners. Finished blocks are 1 3/4". My finished mat will be 22x48" Tip - Your iron is your friend.

New quilter here. Never made a quilt before. This is a very exciting project. Cutting fabric with a cutting wheel on the cutting board is amazing. Much better than old school scissor and ruler. I used triangles cut into 3.5" blocks and then divided. I also made a row with smaller triangles that were cut 2.5".

I am not someone for repeating patterns, but there must be some form of pattern involved in my project.

I am not as privileged as the ladies on the group to have a Bernina machine, but have a second hand Singer Machine which I acquired from a second hand dealer shop.

Grey, grey and grey with a hint of blue and grey.

Love grey as any colour can match with it. I used 100% cotton to prolong the life of my work. Cut-offs used from previous projects I tried to make.

I used a Bernina quilting foot. It works amazing to help keep seam-allowances perfect.

Tip: When matching colours, do it in sunlight. I found that it brings out the natural colour of the fabric.

Total size of Mission 1: 11.5" by 19.5"

This was fun. Cannot wait for Mission number 2.

I am making this item for my Bernette Deco B70 embroidery machine- $30"\times60"$

Biggest challenges:

- *Choosing fabric colours. My colour wheel helped with this
- *Deciding on pattern and size of small blocks, to make up 10" blocks

I used 3 colours and black. The design started with an idea I saw, and from there I made a drawing to determine the size of the blocks

required as well as placement of colours.

I started by cutting 2 1/2" strips, and then cutting it into 2 1/2" blocks.

Afterwards I pinned 2 colours together, right sides together. I marked the centre diagonally, and sewed it together using 1/4" foot Nr 97 and straight stitch plate. The seams were ironed towards the darker colour, although I had to adjust for nesting while constructing the blocks and rows. From there I started packing the blocks to make different shapes.

My first finished row measures 30" x 10"

First looked for colours that would add joy to my sewing room.

Found bright colours. Measured machine cover required and then decided on 4.5 inch squares to be stitched as 1/2 squares triangles.

Using Bernina Aurora 440QE and foot number 37.

Made a 4.5 inch template and quilters ruler to measure and cut with a roller cutter.

Original plan for pattern changed as the colours were arranged.

Matching seam intersections was challenging as one of the fabrics had a looser weave than the others.
